In 2022, we provided **\$13.2 million** in direct aid to 49,200 people

Food Network

- **\$7.7 million** in total food distribution
- **10,800** households assisted
- **3.8 million** pounds of food distributed
- **2.8 million** meals provided to families in need
- **21** St. Vincent de Paul food pantries serving our community

Financial Assistance

- **\$1.4 million** in total utility support
- **5,200** households assisted
- **\$232** average utility payment provided to household
- **\$3.4 million** in total rental assistance
- **6,300** households assisted
- **\$435** average rental payment provided per household

Volunteer Services

- **\$4,200,000** worth of volunteer hours (equates to 67 full-time employees)
- **258,000** unreimbursed miles driven across our city to help those in need
- **140,000** hours of service provided by our volunteers (equates to 67 full-time employees)
- **2000** Vincentian volunteers provided hope to our community in need
- **25** full-time employees supporting our volunteers

Addressing Systemic Change & Resiliency Activities

Our *Resiliency Program* includes Bridges Out of Poverty and the nationally known *Getting Ahead in a Just Gettin’-By-World®*. This program is a 16-week program that helps improve people’s lives by assessing their own circumstances and developing tools and skills as part of their move to self-sufficiency.

Participants create their own plan towards sustainable life, build healthy relationships with community members, set short- and long-term goals, and develop a step-by-step plan to achieve those goals.

In addition to this program, the Society has developed a graduate program where participants and mentors tackle everything from budgeting and negotiation skills to how to cope with daily life and build hope for the future. Right relationships can be a powerful aid to help people along the journey out of poverty.

As a virtual program, each participant receives a Chromebook to use and anyone within the Archdiocese can participate.

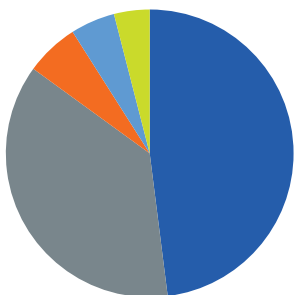

In 2022, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul raised over **\$15.7 million** from a diversified funding base

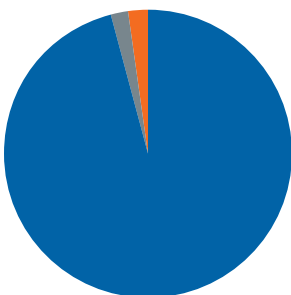

\$15.7 Million



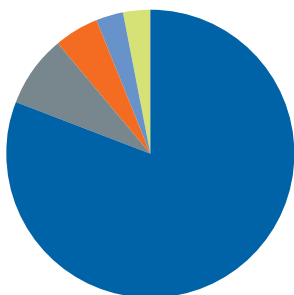
