

■ Mail a Check or Donate Stock

Donating stocks or other noncash investments can help you avoid capital gains taxes while still receiving a fair market value deduction.

□ Send a Wire Transfer

For security purposes, please contact us at 832-538-0327 before submitting your wire transfer, as instructions cannot be emailed. □ Consider Bunching Gifts If you itemize deductions in some years but not others, combining donations into a single year ("bunching") may increase your overall tax savings. ☐ Use a Donor-Advised Fund Make a tax-deductible contribution now and recommend grants to your favorite nonprofits over time. □ Make the Most of IRA Gifts If you're age 70½ or older, you can give up to \$105,000 directly from your IRA to a qualified charity—meeting your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) while reducing taxable income ☐ Think About Your Legacy Including the Society in your will, trust, or beneficiary designations ensures your impact continues for generations to come. □ Plan Ahead Gifts such as business interests or real estate may require additional time for valuations, legal review, and processing—so be sure to start early. Dear Agency Partner,

United Way of Greater Houston is partnering with Houston Food Bank to help meet increased food needs due to the temporary suspension of SNAP benefits.

Beginning October 29, the Houston Food Bank will be holding several large-scale distributions across Harris County, providing approximately 15,000 households per week – specifically federal workers and SNAP recipients – with nutritious foods including protein, produce, dairy and carbohydrates.

For these special distributions, federal employees and SNAP recipients must register in advance.

Distribution locations and a registration form can be found at HoustonFoodBank.org/crisisresponse or call 211 for more information.

211 will be available to help direct people to these large-scale distributions along with pantries across our region 24/7.


