- **\$1.3 million** in total utility assistance


Struggling financially and unsure of the future, she received crucial support from our St. Thomas the Apostle conference, including financial assistance and necessary supplies.

As Cassandra and her child transitioned to a new apartment, the Vincentians continued to offer support and friendship, witnessing her resilience and determination in rebuilding their life.


2023 FINANCIAL REPORT

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul raised over **\$16.3 million** from a diversified funding base. **94% of every dollar** raised went to programs and direct aid.


Sources of Funds
